**NARRATIVE REPORT**

The Community Extension Services led by Dr. Josephine P. Dasig participated in the International Coastal Clean-Up 2023 - Fight for Trash-Free Manila Bay co-hosted by SM Prime and SM Cares at Central Park, SM by the Bay on September 16, 2023 at 6:00 am onwards.

The objectives of this event are: 1) To encourage people to get out to the planet's beaches and help limit the problem of garbage that has either washed up onshore or been left by visitors each day; 2) To promote local clean-up actions on beaches, coastal areas, rivers, and lakes, and other watercourses; 3) To encourage Perpetualite student-volunteers to participate in cleaning our environment and be HELPERS OF GOD. 4) to collect and document the trash littering coastlines; 5) to move towards a trash-free ocean; 6) to raise awareness about the importance of keeping the oceans clean; and lastly, to catalyze communities to rally together with the common goal of cleaning up the garbage on their coastline.

As a reflection, the student volunteers felt very happy, grateful, and fulfilled that they were able to experience how to help and save mother earth, especially the coastal area, by cleaning it and picking up all the trash such as plastic bottles, foam, different kinds of plastic bags, wood, bottle caps, and wrappers of sweets, etc. It is crucial to clean and protect our environment to avoid high health risks and address climate change.

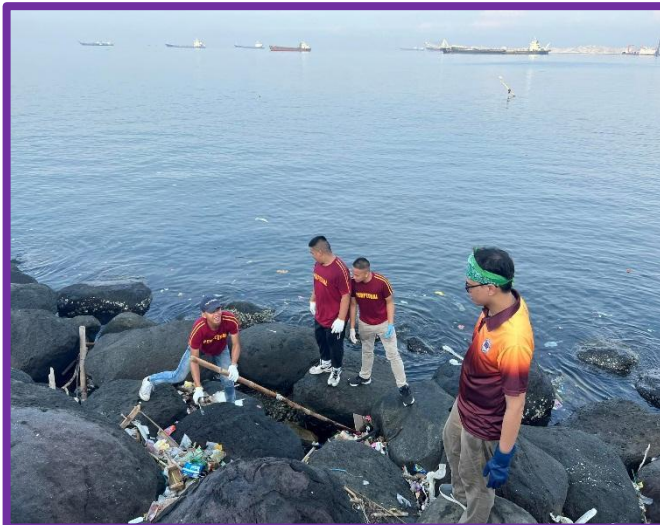
